IV. Presentation:

- Thanks to our January presenter Barbara Lutz who presented on the PATH-s assessment tool which was developed from the theoretical framework, "Improving Stroke Caregiver Readiness."
- In February Dr. Alexandra Giedd, MD, MPH, an obesity medicine fellow at Atrium Health, presented on <u>Caring</u> for Patients with Obesity and facilitated a discussion around the issues of scanning and treatment of stroke in these patients. See her slides.
- Dr. Giedd has a background in Family Medicine and has experience in the emergency department, OR, and in inpatient and outpatient settings.
- In her presentation, Dr. Geid provided information on caring for patients with obesity and took coordinators through a case study of a bariatric patient with stroke symptoms. She then included questions to ask at each point of contact: transport, diagnosis, treatment, impatient, skilled nursing/rehabilitation inpatient. See her slides for consideration questions.
